



CANADA SNOWBOARD COACHING PROGRAM (“CSCP”) REINSTATEMENT PROTOCOL

PROTOCOL STATEMENT: To ensure coaches who go dormant are able to enter back into the coaching stream.

Purpose

1. Ensuring that all coaches who go dormant are up to date in current coach curriculum and training.

Scope and Application

2. This applies to coaches who have not been actively coaching for 5+ years.

Responsibility and Accountability

3. All coaches are responsible for meeting the standards of the Canada Snowboard Coaching Program (“CSCP”) in both the tactical and technical curriculum and remain up to date with ethics training and safe practice.

Definitions and Principles

4. Coaches who meet the following criteria can apply to have their dormant coaching status reinstated to become active.
 - a) Scenario 1 ¹
 - i. Have completed a Canada Snowboard Coaching Program (“CSCP”) Coaching Course
 - ii. Have completed National Coaching Certification Program (“NCCP”) modules and online evaluations for the context at which they are trained in
 - iii. Have purchased and met the criteria for a coach license for the current season – more information click [HERE](#)
 - b) Scenario 2 ²
 - i. Have completed a Canada Snowboard Coaching Program (“CSCP”) Coaching Course
 - ii. Have not completed National Coaching Certification Program (“NCCP”) modules at the context at which they are in training
5. If coaches have met the criteria above, they will be granted a “trained” status for one (1) winter season and required to work with an active coach during that time. Coaches will then be expected to move through the Canada Snowboard Coaching Program (“CSCP”) certification pathway and be completely certified and up to date by the following season.

Reinstatement Process

6. To apply to have their dormant coaching status reinstated and become active, the coach must submit all the information required (Scenario 1 or 2 above) to Canada Snowboard at coach@canadasnowboard.ca

¹ Coaches who have met Scenario 1 will be provided the current reference material and will be expected to stay current with the Canada Snowboard Coaching Program (“CSCP”) curriculum. From there, the coaches will also be required to complete the Canada Snowboard Coaching Program (“CSCP”) Competition Introduction (“Comp Intro.”) Pre-Course.



² Coaches who have met Scenario 2 will have to complete the National Coaching Certification Program (“NCCP”) modules required at their current context. If the courses are scheduled before the beginning of the season, they will have to submit proof of registration. However, they must still complete Making Ethical Decisions + online evaluations. The coach will then be provided with the current reference material and expected to stay current with the Canada Snowboard Coaching Program (“CSCP”) curriculum. The coach will also be required to complete the Canada Snowboard Coaching Program (“CSCP”) Competition Introduction (“Comp Intro.”) Pre-course.³

³ As of July 4, 2019 the Canada Snowboard Coaching Program (“CSCP”) Competition Introduction (“Comp Intro.”) online Pre-Course is in development. If a coach wishes to be reinstated prior to the completed development an alternative solution will be created by the Canada Snowboard Coaching Program (“CSCP”) Technical Experts Committee (“TEC”).
