

Canada Snowboard CAB Program Condensed Checklist

CAB 360 requirements	1	The club is legally registered with documentation
	2	The club is registered for the current season with it's respective PTSA / Canada Snowboard with documentation
	3	The club is properly insured with documentation
	4	The club has submitted documentation of ALL its coaches, which includes proof of valid membership, completed CSCP courses, other relevant certifications and a valid criminal record check.
	5	The club has submitted a document describing all club programs offered including specific disciplines trained, stages of athletes trained, goals, expectations, etc.
	6	The club has submitted a document describing the mission, vision and values of the club.
	7	The club has submitted requests through the online membership system to have ALL yearly club activities sanctioned including general training, specialized training, competition travel and out-of-country travel.
	8	The club has submitted full documentation of its athletes along with proof of valid membership, current stage of athlete, valid FIS license (if applicable) and SAIP insurance (if applicable).
CAB 720	9	The club has submitted documentation of its administration, which includes volunteers, office staff, board of directors, etc.
	10	The club must demonstrate clear understanding of the incident reporting procedure.
	11	The club / coaches must complete end-of-season athlete assessments through Kinduct.
CAB 1080	12	The club has submitted documentation of its yearly training plan (YTP).
	13	The club must have completed and submitted a copy of an emergency action plan for each venue they intend to use.
	14	The club / coaches must complete bi-annual athlete assessments through Kinduct.
