- Background Check (Must be re-completed every 3 years)
- NCCP Modules
 - Safe Sport (Must be re-completed every 3 years)

 - Making Ethical Decisions Online Evaluation
- Club Admins/Head Coaches Please ensure you are confirming that your club coaches have issued 2023/2024 memberships before they take part in an club related activities

FIS + Compete Reminder -

- When registering for the membership through SnowReg, SAIP insurance MUST be selected first.



OUT OF COUNTRY, EVENT & CAMP SANCTIONS + COIs & INTERNATIONAL COACHES

OUT-OF-COUNTRY SANCTION REQUEST

Clubs must submit an Out-of-Country request for any travel outside of Canada.

Approved Out-of-Country sanctions activate athletes' and coaches' out-of-country Sport Accident Insurance Policy (SAIP). Athletes and coaches will not be covered by SAIP abroad if an Out-of-country sanction request has not been submitted or approved.

It is the Coaches responsibility to ensure that ALL travelling athletes and coaches have the appropriate level of SAIP **prior** to submitting their sanction request to their PTSA/Canada Snowboard.

- *Race Inscriptions ARE NOT the same as Sanction Request (Required for CDN WCs and International FIS Competitions) All other CDN Event registration is completed through SnowReg.
- * International Coaches must sign the CS Liability/ Supervision form if they will be coaching CS/PTSA athletes in during event training/competition days (SAIP can only be used with International coaches when tied specific to events (training days and competition days)
- *If you have athletes training with International coaches, we need to ensure they are aware they will need separate insurance to cover them for "general club training."
- *SAIP Insurance CANNOT be purchased after departure from Canada.
- *SAIP Insurance Dates begin the day the athlete or coach leaves the country and CANNOT be delayed.

INJURY AND CONCUSSION TRACKING

ACCIDENT, INCIDENT & MEDICAL REPORTING/SUBMISSIONS

- Coaches must submit an Accident report when a Canada Snowboard/PTSA member is injured and requires medical attention during a sanctioned activity. (Both Canada Snowboard and PTSA are notified once an accident report is submitted)
- Should an injury be serious enough for an athlete to miss a prolonged period of time, Canada Snowboard will reach out to the Coach to confirm whether or not the athlete needs their FIS/IPC/WSPL Points Frozen (After reviewing the accident report the with PTSA).

Coaches must report each accident within 24 hours when a Canada Snowboard member is injured and requires medical attention during a sanctioned activity.

In the event of a head injury and/or any symptoms of a concussion, Canada Snowboard Member Clubs are responsible for following the Canada Snowboard's Concussion policies and procedures.

CS/PTSA Coaches who are coaching Non-CAN FIS Athletes during FIS Events:

Prior to a CS/PTSA Club/Coach taking supervision of a Non-Canadian FIS Licensed Athlete for any FIS

Events (Including pre-race Training/Competitions) CS MUST approve the <u>total acceptance</u> by Nation in question who must assume full responsibility of the athlete including <u>written confirmation</u> by the nation that they guarantee all sections in the ICR including insurance for their athlete.

Supervision will not be approved where the CS/PTSA coach has no other CAN FIS athletes at an event. This will become a private matter between the coach and the athlete.

CS/PTSA coaches who assume responsibility of non-Canadian FIS athlete(s) during a FIS Competition where they have no other CAN athletes participating, do not have any CSA/CS insurance coverage available (ie. No CGL, No SAIP) for these non-sanctioned CS activities. Coaches bear the full responsibility of securing their own insurance that meets FIS requirements for their non-CS activities. Insurance is applicable during CS sanctioned activity only.

Non-CAN FIS Athletes who are Members of CSF Member Clubs:

During FIS events (including travel, pre-race training & competition dates) SAIP and CGL are not available to athletes who are representing another Nation. Under FIS Rules the Nation who holds/issued the FIS Licence is totally responsible for the athlete's insurance – liability and medical

*Non-Canadian FIS Licensed Athletes may only purchase and use SAIP only for sanctioned club training and approved non-FIS training/competitions.

*The Non-Canadian FIS athlete's Nation must submit all FIS Race Entry Forms. These cannot be completed nor submitted by Canadian Snowboard Federation.

Changes to the WSPL Event Categories:

The 2 changes are:

- The use of 5 different levels to categorize events, instead of 4
- A points range on each of the different categories

The new Event Categories are as follows:

- Elite
- Pro
- Challenger
- Amateur
- Grassroots



Points Ranges:

For each of the categories there will now be a minimum and maximum points for each of the categories outlined below

- Elite 600 1000
- Pro 300 800
- Challenger 200 600
- Amateur 100 400
- Grassroots 100 300

Purpose

1. To ensure all athletes, coaches, officials, volunteers and judges wear certified, non-damaged helmets during sanctioned trainings and competitions on snow.

Policy Details

- 6. It is mandatory for all participants to wear a properly fitting, certified, non-damaged helmet for snow sports.
 - Coaches this includes you while you are on the field of play
- 7. To be covered for liability insurance and to ensure the highest level of safety all participants must wear certified helmets inside training and competition areas (inside the field of play).

RULE OF TWO

Purpose of Rule of Two Gold Standar To protect minor athletes in potentially vulnerable situations by ensuring more than one adult is present 2 Certified Coaches 1 Trained Coach 1 Adult 1 Coach 1 Coach 2 Athletes





- · Two trained and screened coaches
- One participant



One trained coach

1 Athlete

- One screened adult
- One participant



- One coach
- Two participants





RULE OF TWO: TEXTING/ SOCIAL MEDIA

- Prohibit one-on-one texting, emailing or online contact between coach and participants. Texting, emailing or online contact should
 - be limited to group text and group email
 - include at least 2 adults
 - be limited to coaching matters
 - include minor participants' parents and guardians (or provide them with the opportunity to receive these texts and emails)
- Social media contact by the coach
 - must be related to the sport program
 - must not contain personal information or references
 - must not happen in private messages to participants





RULE OF TWO IN A VIRTUAL SETTINGS

 Parental Awareness. Obtain consent for virtual sessions, plus inform parents of activities that will occur

 Record each session, and they should be in a professional setting (not a bedroom)

 Weekly debriefing. Encourage regular check ins with parents, coaches, and participants about the virtual training.


HOW DOES THIS AFFECT YOU
