Team Size Exceptional Considerations	Canada Snowboard (CS) may, at its sole discretion, nominate up to two (2) additional eligible athletes—one per gender—to the Snowboardcross High Performance Program (HPP), provided they meet the established eligibility and performance standards within the NextGen Pathway, but whose ranking within the Criteria Ranking Process fall outside the maximum team size CS is otherwise able to support. These athletes would be considered 'NextGen Prospects'. These discretionary nominations can be in addition to the targeted team size outlined in this policy and are subject to Canada Snowboard (CS) having the required resources available. Athletes selected under this clause will receive official HPP team status, including access to ancillary team benefits (e.g., team outerwear, eligibility for Sport Canada AAP nomination, administrative support). However, these athletes will not be provided with Daily Training Environment (DTE) services (e.g., coaching or technician support). They will be expected to remain under the guidance of their personal coach, while working in collaboration with the CS Coaching Staff to develop an Individual Performance Plan (IPP). Athletes selected under this provision will be responsible for covering their own program-related costs, including travel, accommodation, entry fee, and any applicable program fees identified by CS. They may be invited to join specific training or competition initiatives identified by CS, and during these designated activities, the athlete will have access to CS services (as determined by CS) and be under the supervision of the Snowboardcross HPP.

Selection Deadline	The Selection Committee's recommendations shall be made on the basis of the athletes' performance during the Selection Period. The Selection Committee will meet between April 15, 2026 (conclusion of the competitive season) and before May 31, 2026 (conclusion of the 2025-26 CS Athlete Agreement) to identify and rank athletes eligible for selection to the Snowboardcross HPP for the 2026-27 program year.	
Acceptance and Appeal Deadline	Appeals must be submitted in accordance with the Canada Snowboard Appeal Policy and must be received not later than 5:00 p.m. PST seven (7) days after the date the athlete is notified of the decision.

Athletes must demonstrate results projecting toward Top-8 finishes at international events (WC, WCH, OWG) within four (4) years and podium finishes within eight (8) years, as evaluated by the Selection Committee—in their sole discretion—by comparing the athlete's SBX rank and points on the most recent FIS Points List (as of the end of the Selection Period) against the CS SBX Podium Results Track performance targets and other relevant CS data analytics.
Athlete Eligibility - Entry Age to Pathway	N/A	Does not exceed the FIS-defined junior age by more than five (5) years. For the 2025-2026 season, the FIS Junior Age cut-off for International Juniors is December 31, 2006 (per FIS ICR - Rule 2013). Athletes born on or before December 31, 2000 exceed this age limit, but may apply for an age exemption (see requirements below).
Eligibility and Selection Exceptions	Athletes who are named to the SBX National Team are expected to progress and maintain Top 8 international performances in their discipline in order to maintain National Team status on an ongoing basis. As such, athletes who have been on the SBX National Team for a total of five (5) years or more (consecutive or non-consecutive) at the conclusion of the 2025/26 program year must satisfy at least one of the two the following additional eligibility criteria to maintain their status on the National Team thereafter: • 1x Top 6 at a Level 1 event; or • 2x Top 16 Men / Top 8 Women at a Level 1 event.	As an exception to the NextGen Maximum Age Limit, athletes may remain in the NextGen Program for up to two cumulative years by applying annually for a NextGen Age Exemption, which is valid for one program year and requires meeting all specified eligibility criteria below: a. The athlete has not been previously granted a NextGen Age exemption for more than one program year; and b. The athlete meets all other NextGen eligibility requirements (save for the maximum age); and c. The athlete must have PRT results from the just-concluded competition season indicating they are one year from meeting current National Team eligibility criteria, with the PRT determined through historical results modeling of stage-specific performance benchmarks within the discipline, informed by Canada Snowboard's discipline-specific sport analytics, and demonstrated by: • c.i. 2026 SBX WC Overall Standings Rank: Top 50 Men or Top 40 Women; or • c.ii. 2027 FIS Base Points List (SBX) Rank:Top 50 men or Top 40 Women; or • c.iii. 1x Top-Half final result at an eligible World Cup within the Selection Period.
Exemption Submission Requirements	N/A	The athlete must submit an Age Exemption Request to CS that meets the following criteria: a. The submission is received no later than April 15, 2026. b. The submission is emailed to the HPD-Speed at kim.krahulec@canadasnowboard.ca. c. The submission should include evidence and rationale that supports how the athlete's performance over the last two season is tracking towards meting the current National Team eligibility criteria within one year.

Application Submission		
Application Submission Requirements	Applications are required for all athletes who are not formally named to the 2025/26 Snowboardcross HPP. If an athlete is named to the 2025/26 HPP but primarily trains with a coach other than a coach provided by CS, it remains the responsibility of the athlete to ensure their submission is on time and meets the below requirements. All other athletes are responsible for personally submitting their application in accordance with the below requirements. The application submission shall include a copy of the athlete's Individual Performance Plan (IPP) for the season just concluded, aligned with current sport norms and CS's Long Term Development (LTD) framework, and including: a. the athlete's Yearly Training Plan (YTP); b. the athlete's yearly goals, performance gaps, and progress towards closing identified gaps; c. a description of the athlete's ancillary programming (e.g. Sport Science / Sport Medicine); d. a periodized outlines detailing how the athlete's program over the 2025-2026 season supported their goal attainment and/or closing of their stated performance outcomes and gaps; and e. an overview of the athlete's goals and aspirations for the 2026-2027 competitive season. Ranking Process	Nominations will follow the Decision Making Process described in the General Selection Policy (GSP), starting with the highest priority level (Priority 1) and continuing in descending order (Priority 2, Priority 3, and so on). Nominations will begin with Pathway A: National Team (Priorities 1–3). Once nominations to the Snowboardcross National Team under Pathway A have been fully completed, the Selection Committee will then apply the same prioritized process to Pathway B: NextGen Program to fill any remaining available positions, following the same sequence outlined above.	
Team Selection Process		
Selection Committee Team Selection	The maximum number of available positions in the Snowboardcross HPP shall be identified by the Selection Committee at the outset of the 'Selection Process' as of the end of the Selection Period, annually. This number is based on program capacity of the HPP and the listed guiding principles in this Project Sheet. All eligible and ranked athletes will be discussed by the Selection Committee for available team positions based on the order of their final ranking on the ranking sheet determined by the Criteria Ranking Process as outlined above. This ranking determines the priority order of athletes for the available team positions.	
General Selection Policy	This Selection Eligibility and Criteria Sheet is to be read together with the General Selection Policy (GSP), which establishes additional selection criteria and procedures.
